

Findings - The Peace Index - November 2025

The Peace Index is conducted by Dr. Nimrod Rosler of The International Program in Conflict Resolution and Mediation of Tel Aviv University and Dr. Alon Yakter from the School of Political Science, Government and International Affairs, Tel Aviv University.

The survey was conducted in Hebrew and in Arabic by the iPanel research institute between 6-13 November 2025 among 610 respondents: 505 Jewish respondents and 105 Arab respondents. Calculations were adjusted so that the respondents would constitute a representative national sample of the adult population aged 18 and above. Maximum sampling error: +/- 4.2%

The war-termination plan published in late September by U.S. President Donald Trump sets out several core principles:

- 1. Following the implementation of the first phase of the ceasefire and the release of the hostages, a temporary, non-political Palestinian transitional government of experts will be established in Gaza.
- 2. This technocratic government will operate under the oversight of a Peace Council chaired by Trump and former U.K. Prime Minister Tony Blair.
- 3. Hamas will be disarmed under supervision and guarantees provided by regional partner states, and will not take part in the new governing authority.
- 4. Israel will gradually withdraw from Gaza and transfer long-term security control to an international stabilization force.
- 5. Gaza will undergo a process of reconstruction and economic development.

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- 6. Civilian administration in Gaza will gradually be returned to a reformed Palestinian Authority.
